

## Schooled - Gordon Korman

This is your final piece of work on Schooled! You must draw a straight line through the tic tac toe grid, and complete the three tasks that your line goes through. Your completed work is due on Friday, February 26, 2010.

<p>Describe how a character from the book changes during the course of the story. Include evidence from the story to support your opinion. Choose Cap, Sophie or Zach.</p>	<p>Choose an important scene from the novel and dramatize it for the class. You must memorize your lines, have detailed costumes and show your character's emotions through your acting. Stay in character!</p>	<p>Create a map of events in the book. Your map should enable the user to follow the main events in the story, and it should also reflect setting and atmosphere.</p>
<p>Illustrate a poster advertising the novel. Reflect the atmosphere of the novel with your choice of colors and style. Include the title, author, main characters, and elements from the plot</p>	<p>Write a newspaper article investigating the case of the disappearing student activity fund. Include interviews from students and teachers. Think about what the characters would say or do based on what you know about them.</p>	<p>Cap is applying for a part-time job. Write a letter of reference for him describing his strengths and why he would be a good employee. You should aim for 4-5 paragraphs.</p>
<p>Create a rap, poem or song about the novel. You will hand in the lyrics and you will perform the rap or song, or read the poem to the class. Include details about plot, characters and theme (main message).</p>	<p>Explain what you think the main message(s) of the novel is. What point is the author trying to make? Give examples from the book to support your opinions. Write at least 5 paragraphs - introduction, 3 points and a conclusion.</p>	<p>Create a board game with facts and characters from the story. You must include an instruction sheet on how to play your game, trivia questions about the novel, and have the game ready to play by your classmates. The game should reflect the atmosphere and themes of the novel.</p>
