A list of works cited appears at the end of a paper. It lists citations for each source you use.

The main ingredients of a citation are:

Book: author's name, title of book, place of publication, name of publisher, year of publication

Magazine, Journal or Newspaper: author's name, title of article, title of publication, volume, date of publication, section and/or page numbers

Electronic and online Sources: author's name, title of article, title of resource, name of database, type of medium, URL, if applicable, date of document or download, date retrieved

Arrangement of citations is: first lines of entries are flush left and any subsequent lines are indented 5 spaces.
