Fun Fruit Kabobs

(You can use whatever

Ingredients: (Be sure to wash all fruit thoroughly.)

1 apple (cut into small squares) 1/3 c. green seedless grapes 1 banana (cut into chunks) 2/3 c. pineapple (cut into chunks)

1/3 c. red seedless grapes 1 cup non fat yogurt

1/4 c. dried coconut, shredded (or if you have an allergy, substitute with granola, nuts, raisins, or use your imagination!) <u>Utensils:</u> Knife (ask for help from a parent when using a knife in the kitchen!); 2 wooden skewer sticks—(or just pick up with fork and dip without using skewers); large plate

Directions:

- 1. Prepare fruit on large plate. Spread coconut (or substitute in case of allergy) on another plate.
- Slide pieces of fruit onto the skewer until stick is covered from end to end.
- 3. Hold kabob at ends and roll in yogurt so that fruit gets covered. Then roll in the coconut or substitute.
- 4. Repeat steps with other skewer(s) or just dip and enjoy without using any skewers at all!

FEBRUARY IS HEART MONTH IN CANADA Red Cross supports Heart Month in Canada

February is Heart Month and the Canadian Red Cross would like to take this opportunity to remind Canadians about the importance of their heart health. Cardiovascular diseases, including heart disease, are the leading cause of death in Canada. Many such diseases can be prevented through a lifestyle that includes regular physical activity, a balanced diet, giving up smoking and maintaining a healthy body weight.

While it is advisable for everyone to take stock of their heart health, it is equally important to realize that medical emergencies such as heart attacks can and do occur every day. Being prepared to respond in the event of an emergency could be vital to a victim's survival. The Red Cross First Aid program offers comprehensive training that teaches essential life-saving skills using a hands-on approach and steps that are easy to learn, retain and perform.

Red Cross CPR and First Aid courses teach people to recognize the signs of a heart attack and how to act quickly and effectively in an emergency situation. If you see someone experiencing chest pain, nausea, or difficulty breathing, they could be having a heart attack.

Permanent brain damage can occur four to six minutes after breathing stops. Effective bystander CPR, provided immediately after cardiac arrest, can double a victim's chance of survival.

Knowing what to do in those critical minutes can save a life. Knowing how to help a victim of cardiac arrest could mean the difference between full recovery and permanent disability or even death. For over 50 years, the Canadian Red Cross has been a leader in First Aid and CPR training. Over 350,000 Canadians receive training each year, gaining the knowledge, confidence and skills to deal with emergency situations and prevent injuries. BRR! COLD WEATHER FACTS YOU SHOULD KNOW

Reminder to parents and students about dressing for the cold weather! When the temperature falls between -18 and -28, it only takes 5 minutes for exposed skin to freeze! If the temperature is below -28, it only takes 1 minute for skin to freeze! It's very important to take extra precautions to protect your face and hands.

That's not enough! Please wear your winter coat, hat, and mitts or gloves. Layering your clothes also helps...that means to wear a shirt, then a sweater and/or a hoody, then your warm winter coat on top! Parents, please encourage your child to dress for the weather! Sometimes they
